Wal-Mart Donates \$100,000 for Nay Aug Greenhouse

Nay Aug Trivia

“Swiftly flowing water winds its way through a narrow gorge where Roaring Brook is confined by Nay Aug Heights on one side and Moosic Mountain on the other.

Nay Aug Gorge and Falls were designated a National Natural Landmark in 1989. They’re considered unique because Roaring Brook’s perennial flow has eroded a soft underlying siltstone formation similar to the way the Niagara River formed its famous waterfall. In the Delaware Indian language, Nay Aug means “Place of Noisy Waters.”
